Short Span trays, often used for non-industrial indoor installations, are typically supported every 6 to 8-feet, while Intermediate Span trays are typically supported every 10 to 12-feet. Long Span trays are typically. When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the distance between them should be no less than 0.
