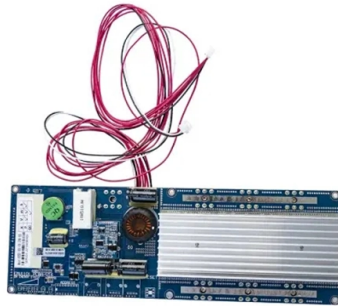


Cormorants on the Red Army Bridge



Overview

The colony relocated from East Sand Island to the bridge after the U. Army Corps of Engineers implemented a management plan in 2015 to reduce their numbers on the island over concerns about predation of juvenile salmonids. In response, the surviving birds relocated to the bridge to build. Representatives from the Oregon Department of Transportation and Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife briefed the Council (see presentation and video) at its November meeting on the recently finalized engineering study and its recommendations to address the large double-crested cormorant colony. Fleeing cull, refugee cormorants settled on the Astoria-Megler Bridge. (AP) — It is near the peak of double-crested cormorant nesting season, but federal biologists have yet to see a single egg on a Columbia River island that once hosted the largest breeding colony in North America. Until. ODFW biologist James Lawonn counts the multitude of cormorants who have taken up residence under the Astoria-Megler Bridge.
