While there are several specific types of listings for power cables, specifically for tray applications, there is no equivalent tray rating for optical fiber cables. According to the 2014 National Electric Code® (NEC), any listed optical fiber cable is acceptable for a tray application. They help move data faster and can lower the cost of setting up networks.
